

**Anagach**  
**INVOC - Level C event**  
**12 November 2017**



Welcome to Anagach – a favourite area for many orienteers, and using our brand new map of the area. There will be courses to suit all ages and abilities including beginners. Families and groups welcome. Dogs on leads only please.

**Terrain:**

Anagach is a very pretty birch and pine wood with interesting contour features and a well-used path system, which skirts around wooded marshy areas. Please respect other users of the forest as the paths are popular with dog-walkers and mountain bikers.

**Map:**

Pre-marked and printed on waterproof paper, scale 1:10.000 with 5m contour intervals. Prepared by Trailmaps (Steve Smirthwaite) using the latest LiDAR data, and funded with the generous assistance of the Berry Burn Community Fund.

**Event Centre:**

Grantown Primary School, on the east side of town. PH26 3HZ. Approx. 34 miles from Inverness. Toilets available in the school (please remove all muddy footwear). Pupils from Millburn Academy will be selling tea/coffee & cakes to fund raise for their trip to help at Romania 2018 kids' camp.

**Directions:**

From Moray head south on Grantown Square, turn left and left again onto the road parallel with the main road/High Street.

From the north, south and east, follow the A95 to the south side of Grantown. At the 2<sup>nd</sup> roundabout (just before the bridge over the Spey) take the 1<sup>st</sup> left (A939) into town. After 600m the road curves left; just after this turn right onto South Street. **Beware queuing traffic as you approach the bend on the A939.**

Please continue cautiously towards the Primary School. The roads are not fast and there will be pedestrians using the route too.

**Parking:**

On South Street to the north of the Primary School; and in the school grounds.

Please be aware of the Fire Station. It is expected that orienteers will abide by the traffic restrictions around the school. Please respect the double yellow lines as keeping these clear is important for safe pedestrian access along to and from the forest.

**Registration:**

1030-1200 – at the Primary School. Start and Finish approx. 650m away.

**Courses:**

White 1.9km

Yellow 2.4km

Orange 2.8km

Light Green 3.9km

Green 4.8km

Blue 7.2km

Brown 9.1km

(Provisional lengths, subject to controlling.)

**Start times:**

Punching starts 1100-1230

Start times will not be pre-allocated, turn up when you are ready and the start official will let you start when there is space on your course. There may be short delays at popular times. Remember it will be getting dark shortly after 4pm so if you think your course might take you a while then start early-ish.

**Courses close:**

1430

**Pre-entry Information:**

Please pre-enter on SI Entries by Monday 6 November if you can. There will also be entry on the day for as long as map stocks last,

**Safety:**

Bring a cagoule (maybe hat and gloves too) depending on the weather. There are ticks in the forest so check yourself afterwards and remove any ticks safely. If you have a pre-existing medical condition we should be aware of then please complete a form at registration which will be kept in a sealed envelope during the event in case the information is required – this will be destroyed afterwards.

Seniors (Members/Non –Members): £8/£9

Juniors/Students (Members/Non –Members): £4/£5

Entry on the day costs + £1.

**Punching:**

Sportident timing. Dibber hire fee is an extra £1.
